The **School Games Mark** is a government led awards scheme launched in 2012 to reward schools for their commitment to the development of competition across their school and into the community. Participating in this process allows schools to evaluate their PE provision and assists them in developing an action plan for future progress. An application is submitted by the school each year and is graded against that year's criteria, which determines your level of achievement: bronze, silver or gold. The **Platinum Award** was launched earlier this year as an extension of the School Games Mark to

reward schools who have maintained **consistently high standards** with their school sport provision. As part of the extended application, the eligible candidates, who had achieved five successive gold awards, were asked to submit a detailed case study along with a supporting paragraph from their School Games Organiser (SGO). Salway Ash is thrilled to have achieved the Platinum Award as one of only 104 schools in the country to do so.
