### Salway Ash School continues it's drive to be Eco friendly. At Salway Ash

school we our proud to have had a forward thinking approach to carbon reduction for a many years. It's been 14 years since our first solar and wind turbine installation. Since then we created a nature trail and spirituality garden, had LED lighting fitted throughout the school, removed our oil powered boiler, had over 100 more solar

panels installed and we have halved the amount of waste which is not recycled. Mr Overment has also introduced the Harmony curriculum throughout the school which focuses on helping children make links between their learning and nature. We hope that this will inspire new generations of children to be aware of humans' impact on the planet. At our July Full Governors meeting we decided to start an Eco committee with a small number of governors. The committee will have links to the children's Eco council and will look to create a school climate action plan. We hope that this will develop our whole school approach to sustainability and look at ways to further reduce our carbon emissions and continue to inspire a new generation to be green!
