


























School Fundraising

Swimarathon Success

Once again, Salway Ash supported Bridport Lions Club's annual Swimarathon with a record **four teams**. One of the youngest swimmer, Sophie Howard in Year 3, was awarded the **'Best Effort' President's Cup** and our Puffa Fish Power team won **'Highest Number of Laps by a School'** with 60 laps (120 lengths) in 55 minutes. It was fantastic to see how well all the children supported and encouraged each other. As a result of our fundraising, **Lions Club has donated £400** to add books to our library and new Accelerated Reader scheme.



Accelerated Reader Scheme



This year, to complement our wonderful **new Library** which Mrs Phillips and plenty of helpers have made into a place that the children love to go and read, we have invested in new software called the 'Accelerated Reader' scheme for our KS2 pupils. Accelerated Reader is a powerful tool for **monitoring and managing independent reading practice, motivating children to read for pleasure**. At the end of each book, the child takes a fun quiz to test their understanding of the text. The children love the instant feedback that they get and it gives teachers the information they need to monitor children's' reading practice and make informed decisions

to guide their future learning. In the Spring, parents will be provided with a login so that they too can follow and monitor their child's progress. At this early stage, we are delighted with the success of the scheme.
