## **Dear Parents/Carers**

In September 2020, all our classes returned to full-time education following the Covid 19 closure in March. Although we hope that the majority of our children will now have an uninterrupted experience, there is the possibility that an individual child, a class bubble, or indeed the whole school, will need to self-isolate for a period of time. We have therefore put in place a plan for remote learning so that all children can continue with their education.

If a child does not have access to a device (such as a computer, laptop or tablet) and/or internet, the school will do all it can to support children's learning. Parents are asked to make the school aware of any barriers to accessing remote learning.

MATHS	Maths CurriculumEach day, children will be able to access maths learning linked to our maths curriculum via eSchools. This will usually include either a PowerPoint or short video to read through or watch. There will be a linked activity which children will be directed to, this maybe a maths activity sheet, or link to an interactive maths game or set task on SumDog.Maths CGP work books will be sent home with instructions on which pages should be completed and when during the closure.
ENGLISH	<b>English Curriculum</b> Each day, children will be able to access English learning linked to our English curriculum via eSchools. Instructions for this may be given in various forms such as pre-recorded video, PowerPoint, online link to learning to read through or watch. There will be a linked activity which children will be directed to, this may be a work sheet, link to an interactive game or set task on Sumdog.
	<b>Reading</b> Children should read every day. They will have a reading book or may read their own book from home. In addition all children have access to MyOn and so can read or listen to books online. All children in Key Stage 2 and some children in Key Stage 1 will access Accelerated Reader quizzes to support their comprehension skills.
	<b>Phonics (usually Year 1)</b> Phonics activities will be shared for children learning or securing their phonics. This may be linked to an online video or Powerpoint accessed via eSchools. There will be occasions when tasks are repeated to support consolidation.
	<b>Spelling</b> Tasks on spelling patterns will be set each week with direction to linked activities on eSchools.
	English CGP work books will be sent home with instructions on which pages should be completed and when during the closure.
OTHER SUBJECTS	A selection of tasks linked to the wider curriculum will be set on eSchools for children to complete through the week. Where appropriate, links may be given to additional resources such as BBC Bitesize or the Oak National Academy to support this work.
